Why we exist: We exist to build long term relationships with many new organizations for better growth and to leverage our skills to help others.


Noteworthy volunteering project:






JEDI at Ian Martin


What is JEDI; what does it stands for; and why is it important?

The diagram is a simple depiction of these complex terms but the suitable differences between inequality, equality, equity, and justice, where:

- Justice is fixing the system that creates inequality, so everyone has equal access to opportunities

Ian Martin Meaningful Work Foundation 2021 Grants

Ian Martin's mission is to connect people in meaningful work. And we know that COVID-19 has created even more obstacles for people looking to secure meaningful work.

With Ian Martin's Stewardship Council and our Meaningful Work Foundation, we are so proud to be able to do our part to help bring the dignity of employment to those who might not otherwise be provided such opportunities.

This year, Ian Martin is giving grants to nine organizations in three countries, totalling more than \$104,000!

This is our most significant contribution to date! We are super happy to be partnering with a wide range of non-profit organizations that provide access to basic needs, skills training, and/or employment opportunities.

Across Canada, in Uganda and in Guatemala, these charities are helping individuals—including single parents, BIPOC youth, intellectually disabled people, former inmates, as well as newcomers, for instance — with life-transforming opportunities. Together, we are breaking down barriers to employment.

2021 Recipients

HOMESUITE

The MWF funds will cover tuition for one program participant to complete their final year of studies at Sheridan College in the field of Human Resources for one year. In addition, the funds will cover basic needs for other single parents studying including transportation and childcare.



The MWF funds will create 20 spaces for the Frontburners Youth Kitchen/Catering Careers program, an 8-week culinary training program for BIPOC youth facing barriers to employment.



The MWF funds will support the Reside program, allowing 40 people experiencing barriers to employment with trades training opportunities. This will support the construction of three units of affordable housing, and provide homes for at least 10 Indigenous women and children at risk of homelessness in Winnipeg.



Options Mississauga provides innovative employment strategies to individuals who have an intellectual disability. Our grant will allow the organization to purchase an industrial shredder which will create multiple job opportunities for intellectually disabled adults.



2021 Recipients



The MWF funds will support their Leg Up program by providing work experience, life and skills training, and meaningful job opportunities for newcomers to Canada, youth, and other individuals facing barriers to employment.



The MWF program will support the employment search efforts of those leaving prison and reintegrating back into the community.



Lil E Coffee Café is in downtown Calgary. Most of their workforce is made up of individuals who have intellectual and developmental disabilities. The bulk of their current staff have never had employment despite endless efforts. The funds granted will allow Lil E to hire more staff and provide dignity in the form of a purposeful job to those who struggle to attain one.



ACTS exists to partner with communities to deliver the life-giving benefits of clean water, including hygiene and sanitation, in Uganda. The grant received will go to the Nyakigyera Project which, among other things, will offer a soap-making workshop for community members, supporting them to register as a cooperative through which they can sell their soap for income.



The Precious Products Women Co-op will teach mothers to create their own all-surface disinfectants and guide them through understanding the techniques to develop sales and negotiation skills, allowing them to support their families financially and create self-sufficiency.


